Based on the representations of BTech 2020 admission batch students and resolutions of subsequent meetings of Director and Dean Academic Affairs with Assoc. Deans of Academic Section and Heads of the Departments, the competent authority has approved the following with regard to conduct of BTech 8th Semester core courses:

Conduct of Core Courses in 8th Semester

All the core courses of BTech 8th semester (theory and lab) are compulsory as per the senate approved rules in vogue. The students have to register for all the core courses. However, keeping in view the representations of the students, only one (01) core theory course (to be decided by concerned HOD) will be taken by the students in the offline mode (or online mode for pre-placement internship students) and rest of the core theory course(s) can be taken in self-study mode. The Heads of the Departments will take feedback from the 8th semester students of their departments whether they want to take particular course(s) (decided by the head of the department as self-study courses) in the self-study mode or in offline mode. The self-study designated course(s) will be offered in offline mode only if all the students opt for this mode. Core laboratory courses will be engaged in offline mode only.

Mode of Teaching Instructions

For core theory course(s) taken in offline mode the teaching instructions will be completely in Offline Mode (online for students allowed for pre-placement internships) and the remaining core theory course(s), if any, will run in self-study mode. Core laboratory course(s) will be engaged as per the past practice (laid down rules). The classes for pre-placement internship students can be engaged beyond official working hours of the institute or on holidays, also employing the services of the research scholars. In case research scholar(s) is(are) engaged for the purpose, he/she(they) will work under the supervision of the concerned course in-charge (regular faculty member).

For students who are allowed for pre-placement internships, they will also be taking the self-study course(s) in the self-study mode. Other theory core course(s) will be taken by them in the online mode (as per senate approved rules in vogue and in practice). They will take the core lab courses also as per the rule/practice in vogue for such students.

For course(s) taken in Self-Study mode, the students will keep in touch with concerned faculty course(s) in-charge for doubt clearance, syllabi, assignments/tutorials, and other components of continuous evaluation. The students will have to cover 100% of the syllabus prescribed for course(s) taken in self-study mode.

Attendance Requirements

For the core course(s), teaching instructions of which are in offline mode, the requirement of attendance as specified in UG rule 9.1 will be applicable; according to which 75% of attendance is mandatory (same is for core lab course(s)).

Evaluations/Examinations

The evaluation procedure for all registered courses will be as per the senate approved rules of the institute. There will be offline exam for both Mid-Term and End-Term components of evaluation for all registered courses irrespective of the mode (offline/self-study). The continuous evaluation component will also be as per the already laid down UG rule 6.1 for all registered courses. For the course(s) taken in self-study mode, a student will be allowed to write Mid-Term and End-Term exams only if he/she satisfies the attendance requirement (as per UG Rule 9.1) in the course(s) taken by him/her in the offline mode.

For students who are allowed for pre-placement internships, their Continuous Evaluation, Mid-Term and End-Term exams will be conducted by the departments as per rule in vogue and in practice for such students.

For course(s) taken in Self-Study mode, the Mid-Term exam will cover 40% of the syllabus and the End-Term exam will cover 100% of the syllabus prescribed for the course.
