NIT Srinagar resolves internal conflict among students, exams to proceed as schedule: Registrar

Action will be taken against those responsible for creating panic on campus

Srinagar, Sep 29: Registrar National Institute of Technology (NIT), Prof. Atikur Rehman Sunday said that internal conflict between students of 5th and 3rd semesters was amicably resolved by the institute's administration. The timely intervention of the administration helped defuse the tensions and restore normalcy on campus, he said.

Prof. Rehman clarified that certain social media posts, falsely claiming the issue to be between local and non-local students, are aimed at disturbing the peaceful atmosphere in the Valley. The matter was an internal student issue among two semesters, which has now been resolved by the administration in accordance with institutional regulations.

"There was a minor misunderstanding among the students, and nothing more. We will take action against all social media handles spreading false information about NIT Srinagar. Legal notices will also be served to them through the proper channels," Registrar said.

Prof. Rehman further mentioned that under the chairmanship of Director NIT Srinagar, Prof. A. Ravinder Nath and SHO Nigeen, both sides of the students were heard. Appropriate action will be taken against those students responsible for creating panic among the students on campus, he added.

Institute's Registrar, Prof. Atukur Rehman also stated that all exams will be held as scheduled, and there are no changes to any events planned on the campus.

On Sunday, a meeting was also held at NIT Srinagar campus which was attended by Dean Student Welfare and wardens of the institute.

It was also decided that appropriate action will be taken against the violators as per law and institutional code of ethics and discipline rules.
